Operations Managers' Report for Streets, Fleet and Parks for March 2020

Streets-

A1 Chip Seal is here in town patching Berryman Subdivision, they have about 20 patches to do in that subdivision, and once complete they will return to do their chip seal and mastic inlay

We have met with and received bids from asphalt companies to do three major patches in town, 5th and Clarke along the Drainage pans, 1st and Hill St intersection by Kersey Pizza and 1st and McIntyre, these areas are in most need

1st and McIntyre, as you may have drove past and seen there is recycled asphalt in a hole we dug up to relieve the heaving the road was getting. The frost layer was about a foot thick and pushing its way through the roadway, with its wound frost can now escape now however this is a temporary band aid fix until we can patch it back, it is also coned off because the rest of the roadway around it is in bad shape, more cars on it the worse it will get

The Alley segment between 1st and 2nd St behind the new Community Center received a top coat of crushed concrete 3/4 inch to powder. This material is being tested to see if all alleys will benefit from this material, how well it can hold up to weather, trash trucks etc. we will be keeping an eye on it and will be working it over the next few weeks

The Alleys will be graded soon as weather allows, any bad spots will get a road base patch then a final grade.

If the material test well then we may be doing more alleys later in the summer or first of fall

Fleet-

The Tahoe is back, on top of a toasted battery there was a sensor that allows the vehicle to switch between its electric battery and normal battery went bad, and drained the main battery to nothing, so no matter how hard we tried to jump it or get a new battery in it, nothing would have worked until that sensor was replaced

The CNG Ford is back and you could never tell it had any damage; the guy did a wonderful job fixing it

The bid for the new GNG truck was selected and sent back to the County to approve and award. From award of the bid on February 12, we have 60-120 days until delivery of the truck, we are hoping for the shorter period but maybe June at the latest or further depending on how the Virus is affecting the dealership

Parks-

Our FTE did not pass all the screening process so we are still in need of a guy or gal, if you know anyone please have them fill out their application online

In the meantime, Chemical Weed out of LaSalle will be spraying and applying a pre-emergent herbicide and 2-4-d herbicide product for us to have our spring spraying done

We do have some backup plans if we cannot get a FTE employee soon

The park bathrooms are closed to the public until further notice

I passed my CPSI test so I am a re-Certified Playground Safety Inspector

Kersey Recreation Board Report

I'll be honest, not sure where to start with this month's board report. In all of the chaos and confusion of the corona virus issue, most of our programs have come to a halt.

Due to many agencies and school districts closing their doors until further notice, our NVAA Spring Volleyball and Soccer leagues were completely cancelled. Volleyball was able to get one week of game play in before the shut downs occurred, however, soccer never had a chance to play. As of right now, our Hot Shots Spring Soccer program with Evans, as well as our Little Kicks Soccer program here in Kersey are still scheduled to start as planned here in a few weeks. I've been in constant communication with Evans and other groups regarding possible changes in scheduling over the next few weeks. As with most agencies, we'll continue to monitor updates and move forward from there.

Because seasons were cut short due to extenuating circumstances, our league has agreed that each agency should consider some type of refund for registrations; by the time you read this I'll have already started that process. Funds will be kept from registrations to cover costs of shirt and equipment purchases, as well as small league fees to cover the cost of scheduling and host site funds for the first week of volleyball that was completed.

Looking forward, we are planning on future programs and activities picking back up in April barring any other extended cancellations. My biggest focus now is to finish planning our summer events and getting summer registrations for youth sports ready to go.

Community Center Happenings

It was such a pleasure to meet all of you last week and I look forward to getting to know each of you better as I get settled in! Let's begin with the COVID-19 situation. I wanted to make you aware that we have taken the necessary precautions at the community center to help keep everyone healthy. We have closed the building to the public and canceled all programming, community and seniors, until further notice.

On a little happier note, since I have started here with the Town of Kersey, in the end of February, we have had some great success in the programs that we have had at the community center. There have been a handful of community paint nights that we have received positive feedback from. The community yoga class has been a reoccurring event that everyone loves. During Spring Break we had a few recreation events here: craft/story time with the High Plains Library, bring your own game night and family dinner/movie night. The movie night was the biggest hit of those three activities, we had multiple families there that ordered dinner and watched The Secret Life of Pets 2. Those events have been so much fun and we look forward to adding more to the calendar in the coming months!

In April when we open again we have plans to keep the community yoga classes Tuesday's at 6:00pm and we will be adding a POUND class Wednesday's at 6:00pm. I will be teaching the POUND class and I am super excited to bring this fun new full-body, cardio and strength training program to the community. Also we have a hunter's education class and another paint night planned. With programming being cancelled for the next few weeks we are really starting to plan events for when we will be up and running again.

To finish out we have some very exciting news... we have finalized the rental information packet for the Community Center!! It is published on the Town of Kersey website and we have had many people reach out already wanting more information. Once we are able to hold gatherings again I am confident that we will have numerous community members wanting to host their events here. One other piece of information with this is that we are still working on the alcohol policy so as of now we would only allowing events that will not be serving alcohol. There is a lot that goes into that part of the

agreement and it is not something that we want to take lightly, so we just want to make sure we have it right.

Older Adults Happenings

Our older adults have adapted really well to the opening of the new center and are beginning to really love it here I think. We still have a lot of things to go through and bring over from the old building, which James and I plan to do in the coming weeks, but for the most part they are enjoying our new space. Our Tuesday/Thursday lunches are still going great keeping our number consistent with 5-8 seniors each day. We are hoping to grow that number as more information about the new building gets out and more members of the community learn about the programs we offer.

We have started to add a few options for some senior fitness classes. Already going is a chair yoga class that is every other Tuesday right before their lunch is served. This has been a really great addition that our seniors are enjoying, so once we resume programming, we will be adding a senior sweat class on the off Tuesday. This is a class that I will also be teaching and it will be more of a strength conditioning class mostly just using their body weight but also incorporating some resistance bands/free weights, eventually. Another fitness option that we will be starting in April is a Tai Chi: Moving for Better Balance which will be taught by a Banner Health employee Mondays and Fridays at 3:00pm. This is a beginner level class that teaches 8 forms of Tai Chi and will work a variety of muscles, enhancing stability and mobility, while staying easy on the bones and joints. We were also going to begin a Walk with Ease program in April, but due to the shutdown that start date is now being pushed back to May.

Along with the fitness classes we have started doing a health help day the first Thursday of every month. This is a day where the Platte Valley Fire Department comes over before lunch and does blood pressure checks on anyone who wants one. March was the first time we had them come over and it was a huge success! Each of our seniors had their blood pressure checked and the Fire Department gave each one of them a book to be able to keep track of their measurements. We plan to continue these checks and will also be adding an additional day for Banner Health to come in and do wellness checks through blood draws. These wellness checks are not limited to our senior population, they will be open to the Kersey community as a whole. Our seniors have also had a few tech-no-savvy classes where a High Plains Librarian comes over to the community center to help our group learn more about

smartphones, tablets, and computers or answer any other technology questions they may have. This is something we will do doing with them twice a month.
