Calls were pretty even with January, and we had a couple incidents of possession of a weapon by a previous offender and DUI's are increasing. We did deal with an incident involving serving a Red Flag Extreme Protection Order, which may have been the first in Weld County. Traffic accidents were a little lower than the previous month, luckily nothing serious.

We are still coming together on the School Resource Officer position and Sergeant Harding completed a grant application and we are waiting to see the result of that. Everyone is working well regarding the implementation and outlining of the position, and everyone has good input and ideas.

We had some calls at the school, mostly involving students not getting along as well as a marijuana charge. We received plenty of assistance from the school and came together to circumvent any issues between students that were identified.

We have seen an uptick on speeding in some areas on the highway and have caught more than a few people going close to or over twice the speed limit. We expect those people not to have a license any longer in the near future. Almost all of them were not residents.

I've had a lot of positive feedback from citizens regarding the department and continue to try to solve or mitigate issues that are of concern when identified.

Patrol trucks are still getting outfitted and hope to have them online soon.

We have taken a big chunk out of the policy revisions and hope to actually be done with them much sooner than expected.

Starting to get officers enrolled in and completing some outside training, which should be of great benefit.

## **Public Works Director Parks, Streets, Fleet, Water, Sewer and Plant**

### **Parks**

Tree Board- Met Monday the 13<sup>th</sup>. The Board began discussions on Arbor Day, the discussion was around the arbor day event and what will be done. The board did receive a CTC grant for 2000.00 in matching funds. The trees purchased will be used on the 1<sup>st</sup> Street Centennial Sidewalk trail.

Centennial Park. Normal checks for locked doors and no damage to facilities continue. The sidewalk around the park remains cleaned so people can walk on cleared sidewalks after storms. Graffiti has been cleaned from the slide and green structure. The playground will be in need of playground chips.

Centennial Trail has remained clean this last month.

Kohler Park. The playground will need some more playground wood chips.

### **Streets.**

we are continuing to fill the largest pot holes and work towards the sides of the street that meets the cement. The soil under the area where the water collected (curb/gutter area) is still very soft and makes filling the hole difficult. Right now, we need dry weather for those areas. Where there are large amounts of the asphalt cracking, we are going to apply a sealer to fill the gaps and see how that works on keeping the asphalt together.

### **Fleet**

PD The two F150's are still at FAS for fitting. We are working with two graphics companies in Greeley to see about getting decals on the trucks as soon as w get them back.

## **Water –**

476-meter reads

- 3 final reads
- 16 visual checks of water tower

The Tower continues to be monitored using telemetry. The levels are consistent.

Continued repairs and replacements to the water meter reading units. The elementary school unit will be next.

**Sewer –** 118 W Hill ST. A call came in we went and inspected above and below the house there were no issues. The home later stated he just needed to plunge the toilet.

## **Plant**

The plant has been operating efficiently. All analytical tests have been within parameters. We have been working on replacing some of the chemical lines from the drums to the delivery systems at the plant. We will be replacing belts on the air pumps within the next month.

A new dvr surveillance system is still being installed. The front doors need a new frame. Once the new frame is in place we will get the DVR installer and the door installer onsite at the same time to make sure everything works correctly.

Kersey Days

The Kersey Days Advisory Committee met on 3/20; the committee voted on and approved the schedule for 8/5, the live music lineup, and discussed advertising options that will reach the broader Weld County community. We believe Kersey Days has a lot to offer families in the area and want to make them aware of our great Town.

We will schedule a special meeting to organize and plan for the races on 8/4 in the coming weeks.

Sports

Summer sports registration will close 3/27 for GEYL baseball and softball. We are hoping to match last year's team numbers, and work to grow both programs through our new coach-pitch and t-ball league formed with LaSalle and Platteville. The goal of the new league is the establishment of a rural town league for our young athletes that supports both competition and sportsmanship. Registration for those sports will conclude at the end of April.

NVAA soccer and volleyball began for the spring season. We are thankful again to RE-7 and KCC for their hospitality with gym usage. The season began 3/18 and will conclude in 5 weeks. Kersey will host two soccer game days on 3/25 and 4/15, along with two volleyball game days on 4/8 and 4/22.

Adult sports registrations will open 3/27 and offer 6 sports divided between the first four and last four weeks of our summer program.

Community Center

In March I have two rentals scheduled and I also had a company rent the room for three days to do some training for their company. Other than that we had one paint class but no other community events this month. Next month we have another paint class scheduled and one rental so far.

We have our first fitness class happening again starting in April and have had great interest in it so far. It is a POUND fitness class that I will be teaching and is offered two times during the week, Tuesday early morning and Thursday in the evenings. We are requiring a minimum early registration of 5 in order to hold each session and so far I am pleased to announce that it looks like we will get both. The morning class has 6 registered so far and the evening is at 3, but I have had many people tell me they are planning to come so just

need to get them to register now. Lots of excitement around this one class, so I am still looking for other instructors to come and offer different classes. I have a yoga instructor that I have connected with just hoping that we can make the days/times work and then get her on the calendar as well.

### Kersey Seniors

The Kersey Seniors group numbers are still consistent with 30-40 meals per day and our in person numbers are about 10-15. In March the group elected to do a St. Patrick's Day potluck so on that Friday we had a group of about 8 come to the building to eat and socialize. We also had a gentleman from AARP come and offer a safe driving class for older adults to take and then potentially receive a discount on their car insurance as a reward for completing the course. This was on March 13th and we had 4 seniors who took advantage of it. No trips or events planned yet for April, but hopefully at their next meeting we can get something put together.
