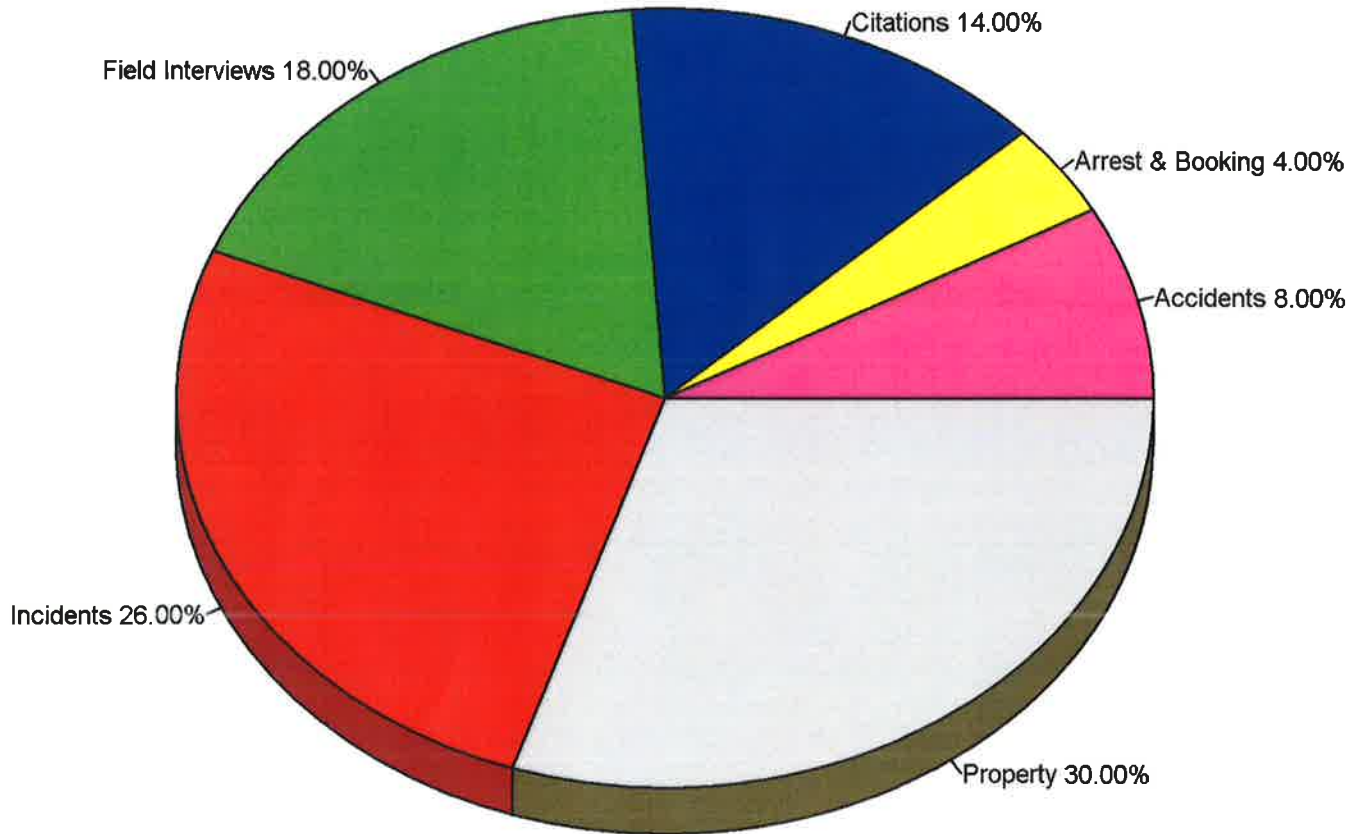

Operations Managers' Report for Streets, Fleet and Parks for April 2020

Streets-

A1 Chip Seal finished up in Berryman Farms for the season; they did a good job over there.

After getting a few more bids in, we choose Goltz Asphalt out of Loveland to do the patching at 1st and McIntyre, 4th and Clark and a small patch on Clark at the end of the alley behind the haircut place. We do not have a ballpark schedule as of yet when they will be here, as soon as I know I will pass along. The two main patches will be quite substantial, while we say patching it is more like replacing the roadway.

We did get some numbers on fixing the alleyways in Berryman, and while they were higher than expected, we shall see how everything shakes out for the rest of the year and if we can pursue this project in 2020

Fleet-

The CNG truck is currently on a 7-week delay due to the Covid-19, no word when the plant will reopen to continue production

The Escape is now at Town Hall for Administration purposes

The "Big White" plow truck had a leaky front cylinder that raises and lowers the plow, while we don't have any snow forecasted this needed to be repaired it is currently at Rush being fixed

Parks-

Sod was installed at Centennial Park for the GOCO project and wow what an upgrade, it looks great. That project is just about wrapped, we have signs and a few plantings left to finish then we will do final reporting to GOCO, due to Covid they extended the due date for the grant, and while we are already, a year ahead of their schedule and additional year was given to finish all grant related projects with GOCO.

We currently have the irrigation systems on at all parks and they are doing good, few minor issues upon start up but that is typical, it is the major issues we don't like

Some tree events were delayed, and while a few will have happened by the time you see this, more reporting on this will be in May's report for you all, Arbor Day was once again pushed due to concerns of having to large of a gathering

Playgrounds and shelters are currently closed off until further notice, the basketball rims were re-installed at the park

Kersey Recreation Board Report

May 2020

I'm sure everyone else is in the same boat as me, but I'm ready for life to get back to normal. Although, from here on, some things will be different in how we go about our daily lives and activities. However things progress we'll make the best of it and work towards brighter days ahead!

As of this date, Tuesday May 19th, most all summer programs and events are either postponed, in a holding partner or cancelled. The only event we have cancelled for the summer for sure is the Family Swim Night in June; Greeley Recreation has informed me they will make a decision on whether or not swimming pools will be open at all this summer. This would affect many groups swimming lesson schedules drastically.

We have altered our June movie night date due to being unable to use the school football facilities. So, what we have decided for that date instead is to have those families who want or are able to participate, either stream, download or rent the 'Lion King (2019)' and watch it at home with their families all on the same night. They can cook a family dinner or prepare a snack together then enjoy the movie together as a family. We'll also give them the option of posting pictures of their family movie night on our Facebook page to be entered to win some Kersey Days 'swag' or registration vouchers. There might also be an option to send out some 'family activities' that can be done either before or during the movie to add a little extra 'fun' the experience!

Both July events, Splash Day and our second movie night, are still on 'hold'; neither have been explicitly cancelled, but are on the verge of some type of major change at the least. On Wednesday May 20th I'll be attending another virtual meeting with Colorado Parks & Recreation specifically addressing summer large group events. I'm hoping from that meeting to gain some further understanding from other agencies in the state as to their schedules, protocols and decision making for summer events. Regardless events happening or not, policy changes will need to be put in place to regulate cleaning routines and other requirements.

Summer baseball programs are also in 'question' mode moving forward; we are going to start some small group (less than 10 people) practices with our 10U and 11U baseball teams this week. I've received some guidelines from Estes Park Recreation on how they have attempted to do the same thing for the past few weeks; as of now, they say it is working great with supportive parents and families involved. At this point I'm hoping our two teams will be able to accomplish similar things over the next couple of weeks; games with Greeley-Evans Youth League are still to be determined pending guidelines set forth by the state and the City of Greeley. If they are unable to host any league games this summer, I'm hopeful we can still continue some type of 'extended baseball camp' over the summer for those kids interested.

T-Ball and Coach Pitch baseball are still in waiting as well; we have teams formed but are still uncertain if Evans will be able to proceed with the league. Other already a part of that league have cancelled completely for the summer due to COVID-19 regulations as well as an extreme lack of pre-registered participants.

Kersey Day planning has almost come to a halt as we've not received many responses back from potential sponsors. With that being said, pending my meeting with CPRA, most likely that event will have to have some major adjustments as well. I'm hopeful Christian, Mayor

Largimanta and myself will be able to have a virtual meeting in the coming days to discuss the Town's stance on policies, regulations and protocol for these types of events as well. Pending those decisions, we will move forward with some type of plans to salvage some portions of the event if possible. I'm hopeful and optimistic that we can make something happen regardless; the summer would absolutely not be the same if we cannot do some type of fun event the conclude the season and move into the school year!
